All of the CALI lessons are available through the Internet in a variety of formats. The lessons are designed to augment traditional law school instruction and can be used as supplemental study material. CALI lessons are written by law faculty and librarians and are regularly reviewed and revised. The format of the individual lessons varies according to the educational objective of the author with some lessons being available via podcast. All lessons include a question and answer section in order that the student can accurately gauge his or her understanding of the subject matter.

You will need to enter the schools' authorization code, **kentucstu106**, when registering on the CALI site before running the lessons. You will also be required to set up a personal password. Once you have accessed the CALI lessons, choose the topic in which you are interested, and then choose the lesson you want to run by clicking on one of the icons indicating the version of the lesson you wish to use.

The CALI exercises are interactive and offer no way to print out the questions and answers. The order in which questions appear in an exercise, and whether certain questions appear at all, is determined dynamically as you proceed through the exercise. You can print some parts of the CALI programs such as instruction screens, lists of exercises and certificates of completion etc.
